Key leaders from the cultural and creative industries met in February at a breakfast debate to launch the **Women in Leadership in the Creative & Cultural Sector** report. With 65% of sector businesses having an all male management team, there is clearly a way to go in creating equality of opportunity and advancement. Barbara Follett MP, Minister for Culture, Creative Industries & Tourism said: "We need to seize this opportunity to respond to the research, to ensure that we continue to raise the profile of women in leadership roles".
